

## New Immigration Regulations in Line with the Non-Citizen Employment Regulation Act of 2015 of Tanzania

As reported by the Philippine Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya, Tanzania has issued new immigration regulations in line with its Non-Citizen Employment Regulation Act of 2015:

- 1. Immigration rules of the United Republic of Tanzania require that any foreigner entering the country should be in possession of a valid travel document or he/she should in possession of valid permit to stay in Tanzania;
- The Government of the United Republic of Tanzania has waived the use of Carrying on Temporary Assignment (CTA) and introduced a business visa to allow foreigners to undertake their assignment not exceeding 90 days. A business visa is normally issued to foreigners from all countries that require visa to enter in Tanzania at the cost of US\$250; and
- 3. Philippine citizens who wish to travel to Tanzania for tourist purpose will be issued a tourist visa at the cost of US\$50 (single entry). For purpose of employment, they will be required to apply for work permit and resident permit from relevant authorities in Tanzania.
