Quarantine Measures for Travelers from the Philippines Arriving in Taiwan

The Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) of Taiwan has announced that starting 26 July 2020, travelers arriving in Taiwan, R.O.C. from the Philippines must follow quarantine measures as follows:

1. *Nationals and Residents.* Taiwanese nationals and foreign nationals with an Alien Resident Certificate or a resident visa, migrant workers, foreign students, and foreign diplomats must, whether they have symptoms or not, have their specimens collected at the airport upon entry into the country. Those who have symptoms shall be transported to a group quarantine facility to await test results; asymptomatic individuals shall undergo a 14-day period of home quarantine at their residence or at a quarantine hotel.
2. *Non-Residents.* Foreign nationals without an Alien Resident Certificate must provide a certificate of a negative COVID-19 test result issued within three days of boarding before they are allowed to board their flight that will transit through or enter Taiwan. Those who wish to stay must also undergo home quarantine for fourteen (14) days after entry into Taiwan.
