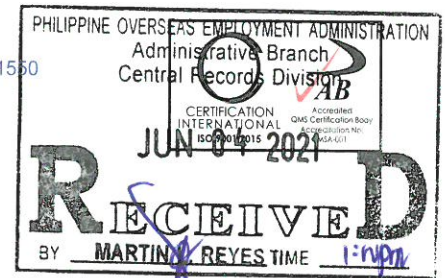

## MALAYSIA DECLARES TOTAL LOCKDOWN

Malaysian Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin announced last May 30, 2021 that the entire country will be placed on a total lockdown from June 1-14, 2021 due to the significant increase in COVID-19 cases.

During this period, all sectors are NOT ALLOWED to operate EXCEPT for the following essential economic and service sector which are listed by the National Security Council: <https://asset.mkn.gov.my/web/wp-content/uploads/sites/3/2019/08/SOP-AM-PKP-Seluruh-Negara-Kemaskini-31-Mei-2021.pdf>.

The following are the controlled movement to be implemented during the lockdown:

- Only two (2) household representatives are allowed to go out just to get supplies food, medicine, dietary supplements and basic necessities within a radius not exceeding 10 kilometers from his residence.
- A maximum of three (3) people only including patients are allowed out to get health care services, medical, screening testing, safety or emergency in radius not exceeding 10 kilometers from his residence or to the place nearest to his residence if the health or medical service is not within a radius of 10 kilometers from his residence.
- The number of passengers in taxis and e-hailing is limited to two (2) people only inclusive driver, passenger must sit in the back.
- Same goes to the capacity of private vehicles: 2 people from the same household, and 3 (including the patients) for health and medical purposes.
- Activities and services at all airports and ports are allowed to operate.
- Sea and land public transport services are allowed to operate based on 50% of vehicle capacity (operating hours and frequency subject to the Ministry of Transport).

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- Movement for cases of death and natural disasters is allowed after obtaining permission from Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM).
- Disaster or humanitarian aid movements by NGOs need to get permission from the State Disaster Management Committee or the Disaster Management Committee Districts in the area affected by the disaster and such aid is channeled through Disaster Operations Control Center (PKOB) in the area.
- Movement across districts and states for the purpose of COVID-19 vaccination at the Center Vaccination (PPV) outside the district or state of residence is permitted by showing appointment details on the MySejahtera app, website or SMS.
- Members of Parliament and State Assemblymen are allowed across states and districts to visit their respective areas without performing any ceremony.
- Movement for Short Term Business Visitors under the approval of the One Stop Initiative Center (OSC) for official or business purposes is allowed after obtaining permission PDRM.
