ALL LICENSED PHILIPPINE RECRUITMENT AND MANNING AGENCIES

SUBJECT: SUBMISSION OF MONITORING REPORTS ON THE STATUS AND

THE DEPLOYED OFWS/SEAFARERS ONBOARD CONDITION OF

AFFECTED BY THE RUSSIAN-UKRAINE CONFLICT

In view of the recent invasion of Ukraine by Russia resulting in a number of Filipino workers displaced from work and evacuated to nearby countries, and oceangoing vessels in the area of Black Sea reportedly getting hit directly or indirectly allegedly by Russian missiles, you are hereby directed to submit reports in the OFW Welfare Monitoring System on the status and condition of all your deployed workers to Ukraine and Filipino seafarers onboard vessels affected by the ongoing conflict.

Please be reminded that monitoring and reporting the status and condition of deployed Filipino workers onsite and seafarers onboard is in compliance with Section 209, Rule I, Part VIII of the Revised POEA Rules and Regulations Governing the Recruitment and Employment of Landbased Overseas Filipino Workers of 2016, Section 193, Rule I, Part VI of the Revised POEA Rules and Regulations Governing the Recruitment and Employment of Seafarers of 2016, POEA Memorandum Circular (MC) No. 12, Series (S.) of 2018, M.C. No.9, S. of 2019, and Advisories No. 1, S. of 2020, No. 30, 37, and 62, S. of 2021.

Further, significant and critical incidents involving a deployed Filipino worker/seafarer should be reported to the POEA within five (5) days from occurrence, thereof.

Failure to submit the required reports shall warrant the imposition by the Administration of such sanctions as it may deem appropriate.
