KLT passers should submit requirements to POEA

The Philippine Overseas Employment Administration is calling on remaining passers of the 6th Korean Language Test (KLT) to comply with documentation requirements to enable them to be offered jobs by Korean employers as soon as possible.

Two months had lapsed after the KLT for Filipino jobseekers but not everyone out of the 2,755 applicants who passed the test has been included in the roster of workers in Korea's Employment Permit System.

Aside from a few medical impediments, another reason why a number of applicants have not been included in the roster is the delay in their submission of valid passports, which is part of the profile requirements for the workers.

The POEA has already requested the DFA Consular Affairs to issue passports to the remaining EPS-KLT passers at their satellite office at the POEA building.

The POEA advises concerned applicants to report to the Manpower Registry Division at the POEA ground floor lobby for appropriate endorsement to the DFA passport unit.
