POEA suspends recruiter's license for deploying HSWs as office workers

Administrator Hans Leo J. Cacdac has ordered the suspension of the license of CAZ International Inc. for attempting to deploy six household service workers as office personnel and sales persons.

The Philippine Overseas Employment Administration had *motu proprio* initiated the complaint against CAZ International after personnel of the Bureau of Immigration at the NAIA Terminal 1 stopped from boarding their respective flights six (6) women who admitted that they would actually work as domestic workers – a job different from those indicated in their travel documents.

Cacdac said the agency lied to the POEA and was actually trying to circumvent the rules and regulations on the recruitment and deployment of HSWs by processing the workers as cashier, receptionist, and sales persons.

"CAZ International was not forthright in its representations to the POEA regarding the employment status of their recruited OFWs. They submitted for processing documents indicating different job positions, compared to their really intended jobs as domestic workers," Cacdac said. /END
