Saudi's Ministry of Health needs 400 Filipino nurses

The Ministry of Health of Saudi Arabia is in urgent need of 400 female nurses, Labor Secretary Rosalinda Dimapilis-Baldoz announced yesterday.

Secretary Baldoz said the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration has reported that the nurses will fill up vacancies in various nursing departments of King Saud Medical City in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

POEA Administrator Hans Leo J. Cacdac said applicants should not be more than 40 years old; graduate of Bachelor of Science in Nursing; with Board License; and with minimum of two years related experience.

Cacdac said the Ministry of Health offers benefits that include SR600 food allowance per month, free housing and transportation services; tax free income; 5.5 percent annual salary increase; up to 20 percent intensive care allowance; 30 days vacation with pay; and healthcare coverage.

Cacdac advised qualified applicants to register online at www.eregister.poea.gov.ph and personally submit a detailed resume with job description, school credentials, employment certificate, photocopy of passport, and two pieces 2X2 pictures to the Manpower Registry Division, Window T, Ground Floor, Blas F. Ople Building, Ortigas Avenue corner EDSA, Mandaluyong City on or before April 7, 2016.
